The global recovery continues to be a story of two economies – robust strength in emerging markets; and, fragile and tentative economic growth through much of the industrialized world. Global trade tensions are on the rise as China's undervalued currency is producing a significant export advantage and Brazilian Finance Minister Mantega coined the "international currency war" term following a series of interventions by Japan, South Korea and Taiwan in order to make their currencies cheaper. What are the implications for the Canadian dollar, asset valuations and commodity prices? Join us for a lively presentation on the implications for interest rates and equity markets in 2011.

Pascal Gauthier is Senior Economist for TD Bank Financial Group. Based on Toronto, Pascal Gauthier joined the Economics department at TD Bank Financial Group in January 2007. His chief responsibilities include analyzing and forecasting regional and industrial developments and conducting research on a broad range of topics, including real estate and public policy. He holds a B.Sc. degree in Economics from the Université de Montréal, an M.A. degree in Economics from the University of British Columbia and pursued his Ph.D. studies in Economics at the University of Minnesota.

He is an active member of the Toronto City Summit Alliance labour force readiness working group in preparation for Toronto Summit 2011. In collaboration with the Ryerson Diversity Institute and other partners, he is invested in research on issues related to women in the labour force as well as overall diversity in the workplace.
